


IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

ACADEMIC CREDIT AND GRADE REPORTS: Summer School course offerings include one-semester and two-semester courses. The two-semester courses are Algebra IB, Spanish II, and Geometry. Upon completion of a course, a report with the final grade will be sent to the student and the designated school.

ATTENDANCE POLICY: Two-semester courses will meet four hours each day; other courses for credit will meet three hours each day. Credit is forfeited if more than two days are missed per semester. The student assumes responsibility for making arrangements with the teacher to make up material missed during absences. Arrival after the stated class time is considered as tardy to class. Four tardies, excused or unexcused, equals one absence. A student who is more than ten minutes late but arrives within the first half of a class will receive a half-absence; a full absence is awarded if a student arrives during the last half of class. Note: There will be no classes on Friday, July 4, a federal holiday.

SUMMER SCHOOL DROP/ADD POLICY: Students may drop a summer school course within three school days of the beginning of each summer semester without consequence. After the three-day deadline, a grade of WP (withdrawal/pass) or WF (withdrawal/fail) is recorded on the transcript. WP and WF grades are not included in the student's grade point calculation.

CODE OF CONDUCT: Students are expected to adhere to all rules and regulations as stated in the 2013 - 2014 ESD Student Handbook, available online at www.esdallas.org. Uniform rules, however, do not apply. The Episcopal School of Dallas may dismiss students from the program for non-compliance with the rules, inappropriate conduct, or unsatisfactory academic progress.

DRESS CODE: Summer dress is casual, but appropriate. Tasteful shorts, slacks, or skirts are required. Tank tops and hats are not allowed. Shoes and sandals are required at all times. Each classroom teacher is the authority in matters of dress. Science teachers may require students to adhere to clothing regulations related to laboratory safety.

TEXTBOOKS: Textbooks should be purchased online from MBS. Allow two weeks for delivery.

REFUNDS: Class fees include a \$50 non-refundable deposit/cancellation fee, which is applied if a program is cancelled prior to one week before the start of the program. Cancellations within one week of the start of a session incur a 50% cancellation fee. Once a program starts there are no refunds. If ESD cancels a program you will be refunded 100%.

SUMMER CREDIT

ALGEBRA 1B ENTERING GRADE 9, TWO-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT OF CREDIT
This course builds on the foundations laid in Algebra 1A. Course topics include the study of linear and quadratic equations, functions and systems, their graphs, linear inequalities, a formal introduction to rational expressions and radicals, and, time permitting, elementary (right triangle) trigonometry. Permission of the Department Chair and Upper School Head is required. Prerequisite: Algebra 1A.

Session: ALG1B June 2 - July 15 8:00 - 12:00 \$1,400 1/2 Credit

AMERICAN GOVERNMENT

ENTERING GRADES 11 - 12, ONE-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT OF CREDIT
This course is an examination of the American political system with an emphasis on structure and function of government at both state and national levels. The role of political parties and interest groups will be examined. Other systems of government will be briefly compared. Prerequisite: junior or senior standing. Priority given to rising seniors; class has limited enrollment.

APPS DEVELOPMENT

ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12, ONE-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT OF CREDIT
Handheld computing devices are swiftly replacing traditional computers as the primary way most users interact with email, the Internet, and their own personal data. Creating mobile apps can be profitable or simply an engaging platform for personal expression. This course will introduce programming concepts through the development of applications for mobile devices. Students will create apps that respond to internal events (device orientation, the clock, or a timer), user events (a button click or text entry), and external events (receiving a text or data from the web). The class will program with blocks, simplifying the coding aspects. This allows students to focus on the logic of each program and the design of the user interface. Android will be the development platform for the class. Android tablets will be available for deployment and testing of student work. The skills learned in the class will be transferable to development for other platforms.

Session: APPS June 2 - 27 8:30 - 11:30 \$700 1/2 Credit

ECONOMICS ENTERING GRADES 11 - 12, ONE-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT OF CREDIT
This course is an introduction to the tools and concepts of economic analysis. Emphasis is placed on the application of these tools to national and international economic issues. Prerequisite: junior or senior standing. Priority given to rising seniors; class has limited enrollment.

Session: ECON June 2 - 27 12:30 - 3:30 \$700 1/2 Credit

ETHICS ENTERING GRADES 11 - 12, ONE-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT OF CREDIT
This course is an introduction to ethical theory and practice wherein the major philosophical systems in western thought are emphasized, as well as the particular areas to which they are directed. Students will be encouraged to reflect on traditional religious and universal values as they relate to their respective morals. Students will also analyze their own faith formation and decision-making processes, especially in conflicted

or ambiguous situations. The goal of this course is to investigate the myriad ways in which a person develops his or her principles. In essence, how can men and women be good? In an attempt to answer this important question, current events, literature, and social media will be examined. Partial list of topics: abortion, immigration, and war. Prerequisite: junior or senior standing. Priority given to rising seniors; class has limited enrollment.

Session: ETH June 2 - 27 8:30 - 11:30 \$700 1/2 Credit

GEOMETRY

ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12, TWO-SEMESTER COURSE; 1 UNIT OF CREDIT
In this course students will learn the essential Euclidean geometric properties found in the world around them. These properties will be used in deductive reasoning and in solving problems. An inquiry-based learning model will be emphasized along with individual and group research projects. Students will be asked to demonstrate understanding and application of the geometric concepts covered over six weeks. Permission of the Department Chair and Upper School Head is required. Prerequisite: Algebra 1.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS

ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12, ONE-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT OF CREDIT
This course focuses on the health components of physical fitness, nutrition, and the benefits of exercise. A personal care unit focuses on the topics of stress, emotional wellness, addictive behaviors, and sex education. Students must attend the last day of class to receive credit.

HONORS COMPUTER SCIENCE

ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12, ONE-SEMESTER COURSE; 1/2 UNIT CREDIT
This course begins with the basic concepts of computer architecture and operations, followed by a formal study of object-oriented programming, based on the Java Programming language. Students will work with data elements, Java Library classes, and simple decision control structures through Java code reading and writing. This course is intended to prepare students for Computer Science A-AP.

Session: COMPSCI June 2 - 27 12:30 - 3:30 \$700 1/2 Credit

SPANISH II

ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12, TWO-SEMESTER COURSE; 1 UNIT OF CREDIT
This course is a continuation of Spanish I, and stresses the development of listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills with extensive concentration on grammar and vocabulary. Prerequisite: Open to ESD students only. Permission of the Department Chair is required.

NON-CREDIT COURSES AND PROGRAMS

BABYSITTING CERTIFICATION AGES 11 - 17

Calling all babysitters! Learn how to be a safe, responsible, and great babysitter. Students will not only learn the ins and outs of babysitting, but also get certified in CPR and First Aid. This course is taught by instructors from "It's Breathtaking."

The class size for this course will be small enough to allow time for plenty of individual attention! Open to all incoming and present ESD Upper School students only. There is a two-session maximum per student.

CREATIVE WRITING ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12

Upper School English teacher, Christine Nicolette-Gonzalez, has been teaching creative writing for many years and would love to help you hone your writing talents. This enrichment experience will also offer several field trips that will serve as catalysts for you to find your inspiration and creativity. By the end of the week you will even have a collection of your creative work.

DIGITAL BRANDING FOR STUDENTS ENTERING GRADES 8 - 12

Do you want to learn how to set yourself apart from others on the web? Learn how to create a digital portfolio, show up in Google search results, and build your own brand online. Having a digital presence could help you get into one of your favorite colleges or land you that first job!

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP

ENTERING GRADES 7 - ADULT

In this workshop, you will learn how to properly expose, download, and edit your digital photographs like a pro. ESD's George Fiala will show you how to transform your images into beautiful works of art by using Adobe Lightroom and Photoshop. Learn how to shoot color and black and white in this course. Several professional photographers and their images will be studied as well as a documentary film. Computers and software will be provided by ESD, but the student or adult must provide cameras. Digital SLR cameras with raw file capability are recommended.

FIGHT LIKE A GIRL GIRLS, ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12

This seminar offers young women the opportunity to develop a practical set of verbal and physical skills in self-defense. Students will be taught the physical and mental skills that can be used against a bigger and stronger opponent instead of trying to directly challenge a male's physical strength. All topics relevant to self-defense will be covered including crime statistics, prevention, the psychology of fear, what to do if your attacker is armed, and date rape. This program will fundamentally change how women think about self-defense and their own capabilities. The main goal of Athena's Strategies seminars is to give women a simple self-defense plan that will be applicable to most self-defense situations. Priority is given to ESD students.

GAMING UNPLUGGED ENTERING GRADES 5 - 12

Join ESD teachers and gamers Chris Steele and Scott Goetsch to see how much fun the world of modern board-gaming can be. The morning session will focus on fun, physical games, and board and card games students play with their friends. Among other games, students will knock out each other's chickens in Loopin' Louie, knock down walls with Crossbows and

Catapults, and flick cars past them in PitchCar. Students will also team up with camp-mates to cure the world from a Pandemic, save treasures from the Forbidden Island, and defend their castles from Ogres and Trolls.

Afternoon sessions will focus on strategy. Students will look at classics like Risk, and also explore many new mechanics including auctions, roundels, variable player powers, variable player turn orders, and victory points. They will have a chance to play most of the top-rated board games in the world like Agricola, Puerto Rico, Powergrid, Race for the Galaxy, Ticket to Ride, Betrayal at the House on the Hill, Sucking Vacuum, Carcassonne, Dominion, and Eminent Domain. GEL MONOTYPE PRINTING WORKSHOP

AGES 14 - 18, OR TEACHER PERMISSION

Make beautiful art prints using a Gelli Arts printing plate. It looks and feels like a gelatin monotyping plate, but is more durable, flexible, and reusable. This one day workshop is an innovative way to introduce monotype printing. Students will experience the exciting process of creating unique prints without a printing press or dangerous solvents. Students will explore this non-mechanical, painterly method of creative expression producing images that resemble mechanical printmaking techniques. Students will complete several finished works by the end of the day that can aid in building and enhancing their Advanced Placement Studio Art or College Portfolios. Students should bring a sack lunch and a drink. For serious and mature students only; limited to 16 students.

GETTING A HANDLE ON UPPER SCHOOL

ENTERING GRADE 9

Designed to help new and current students adjust to the academic rigors of the freshman year at ESD, the course focus is on English, history, and math. Students learn study skills to help them be successful during ninth grade, including strategies to complete their summer reading. At night, students will be asked to read assigned chapters of their required summer reading book to facilitate class discussions and to provide practice with skills learned in class. Students also work on effective study strategies for the World Cultures class and review major math concepts.

INTRODUCTION TO SPANISH I ENTERING GRADES 8 - 12

This one-week course will focus on the four skills involved when learning a foreign language: reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

Special emphasis will be given to memorizing the alphabet and correct pronunciation of words.

LIFE DRAWING & PAINTING: BUILDING YOUR PORTFOLIO

AGES 15 - 18, OR TEACHER PERMISSION

This weeklong and half-day course will focus on the human figure and will be customized to meet the needs of students at all levels. We will explore a variety of drawing and painting mediums; charcoal, ink wash, pencil, pentel, conte crayon, pastel, acrylic, and watercolor. Students will learn how to determine the proportions of the human figure and how to model the figure 3-dimensionally. An exploration of both local and expressive mark making and color application will be presented. Emphasis will be placed on helping students create works that will aid in building and enhancing their Advanced Placement Studio Art or College Portfolios. Students will work from a live, clothed model. For serious and mature students only; limited to 18 students.

Session: LIFE June 9 - 13 1:00 - 4:00 \$325

MAKING POTTERY ON THE POTTER'S WHEEL

GRADES 5 - 12

Have you ever wanted to try the potter's wheel? Now is the time! Spend a week with ESD's Barbara Brault making pots on the potter's wheel. Students will spend the first five days of camp making pots on the wheel, and then glazing their work in the final three days. Old clothes a must!

Session: POTTERY June 2 - 11 10:00 - 12:00 \$250

PRINTMAKING: MONOPRINTS ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12

This class introduces students to the joys of printmaking. Little or no previous experience is required. Some of the techniques to be covered include the mixing of Akua in additive and subtractive techniques, use of stencils and templates, dry point etching, multiple plate use, registration, and printing techniques. AP students may choose to use these works in the Breadth Section of their portfolios.

Session: MONOPRINTS August 4 - 8 1:00 - 4:00 \$325

PORTFOLIO PREPARATION ENTERING GRADES 10 - 12

Portfolios are needed for AP Studio credit and Art School Admissions. During this focused class, each student will receive individual guidance and instruction towards building his or her portfolio. This may include developing ideas for an AP concentration, or completing specific drawings for an application. All students will be required to document their work digitally and are encouraged to make an iPhoto book. It is beneficial (but not required) for students to have a Mac laptop and flash drive. Instructor approval required; limited to eight students.

REVIEW OF FRENCH I ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12

This course introduces students to advanced concepts that they will encounter during French II and III. Prerequisite: French I.

Session: REVIEWFR1 August 4 - 8 11:00 - 1:00 \$160

REVIEW OF SPANISH I AND II ENTERING GRADES 9 - 12

This online review course is for students entering Spanish II or Spanish III. Students can use this course to strengthen their Spanish skills before they start the next level or as preparation for the Spanish placement test given in June. In a flexible time format, students will complete and turn in online activities, including grammar practice, verb drills, and samples of writing, speaking, and listening. The instructor will deliver the course through the Schoology learning management system. Once they complete their coursework, students will come to campus to take a written test to measure their progress.
