Originally organized by a group of ESD parents to fill in the funding gaps of the athletic department, the ESD Booster Club is now an official school organization within the ESD Parents' Association and is dedicated to specifically supporting ALL ESD Eagle athletic teams. Some perceive the ESD Booster Club as being a male, football-only, club. Nothing could be further from the truth. A review of the past two years of the gifts made by the Booster Club to the individual sporting teams of ESD will find that no funds have been specifically allocated to football; rather monies have been gifted to the needs of specific sports like crew (new racing oars) and women's field hockey/lacrosse (portable sound system). The largest percentage of funding has been given to the training and weight rooms which are of benefit to all ESD students.

One of the goals of this year's board is for the Booster Club to become even more inclusive of the entire ESD community, with additional efforts to incorporate the Lower and Middle Schools into club activities of service and fundraising. A message heard loud and clear from parents is the need for concessions service down to the middle school game level. By automating our recruitment to allow for volunteer sign-up from the Booster Club page, www.esdallas.org/booster, we are hoping to establish concessions service to Middle School sports for the 2011 - 2012 school year. In addition, we hope to further tap into the energy and spirit of the Lower School with new events like the "Lower School Night" football game and the recent spring "Movie Night" held in cooperation with the

All of our best efforts and plans cannot be realized without your support, both in time and treasure. You would not be reading this today if you did not already understand and appreciate the mission of the ESD Booster Club. I encourage you to once again renew your membership either on-line at the Booster Club page (www.esdallas.org/booster) or using the membership envelope included in this mailing.



ESD CREW HAS SUCCESSFUL SEASON; MEN'S VARSITY QUAD WINS STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AND GOES ON TO NATIONALS

ESD Crew had one of its most successful years in ESD history. Crew's season includes both fall and spring. Earlier highlights were covered in the last issue of the Talon. ESD Crew built upon its fall success in the spring season.

The Texas State Championship Regatta, a 1,000 meter sprint race, was held on April 30, 2011 at Austin's Town Lake. This is the principal regatta in a series of events that determine the best high school rowers in Texas. Twenty-eight members of ESD Crew raced in the events.

ESD Men's Varsity Quad (Nikolai Laba

'12, Ryan Nelson '11, Pierce Jamieson '11, and William Meier '11) provided the team's highest accomplishment of the day. In this fiercely contested six-boat state championship



final, the premier sculling event of the regatta, Laba, Nelson, Jamieson, and Meier took control of the race early on. They held their lead through the duration of the race to defeat long-time rivals, St. Mark's School of Texas, by a margin of four-tenths of a second. During the awards ceremony at the end of the race weekend, the ESD men were awarded the Mullen Cup, named for John Mullen, founder of both the Dallas Rowing Club and St. Mark's Crew. The Cup was first awarded to St. Marks in 1991 as the winners of a three-boat championship against ESD and the Austin Rowing Club, in Dallas, Texas. The Episcopal School of Dallas is proud to have earned this State Championship win in this 20th year of the contest.

In addition to the success of the Men's Varsity Quad, of twelve boats advancing to the finals in their respective events, ESD athletes had top three finishes in nine events.

Finishing third in their events were Cat Turner '13, CeCe Turner '14, Chloe Carry '11, and Chandler Naidu '14 (Women's Varsity Quad); Ryan Nelson '11 (Men's Varsity Single); Cat Turner and Naidu (Women's Lightweight Double); and Araceli Gallegos '13 and Hannah Winton '12 (Women's JV Double). Finishing second in their events were David Schluckebier '12, Brian Yen '12, Bryan Beagles '13, and Shane Reddell '12 (Men's JV Quad); Schluckebier and Yen (Men's JV Double); and Jakesy Jordaan '14 and Michael McCrory '14 (Men's Novice Double). The Men's Novice Quad (Jordaan, McCrory, Carter Boisfontaine '14, and Alec Smith '14) posted a first place finish in their event.

On May 7 and 8, ESD took to the water at the Central Youth Rowing Championships Regatta in Oklahoma City where crews competed for a bid to race in the USRowing Youth National Championship Regatta in June. With 18 of our boats advancing to the Regional Championship Finals, ESD had ten outstanding medal finishes.

Nikolai Laba, Ryan Nelson, Pierce Jamieson and William Meier continued their outstanding season by placing second in the Men's Varsity Quad. These men had been extremely dedicated to preparing physically and mentally for Regionals, and the result they achieved was a feat last realized by ESD's Men's Varsity Quad in 2000. Their second place finish qualified them for Nationals.

Other medal finishes included third place finishes by Carry (Women's Varsity Single); Laba and Meier (Men's Lightweight Double); Schluckebier and Yen (Men's JV Double); Jordaan,

McCrory, Boisfontaine, and Smith (Men's Novice Quad); and Laura Lynn De Loache '14 and Elizabeth Patrick



'14 (Women's Novice Double). Finishing second in their events were Schluckebier, Yen, Beagles, and Reddell (Men's JV Quad); Gallegos and Winton (Women's JV Double); and Amanda Eggers '13 (Women's B Single). Placing first in the Women's Novice Quad event were Caroline Brennan '14, Jenkins Bender '14, De Loache, and Patrick.

The USRowing Youth National Championships were held June 10-12, 2011 on Melton Hill Lake in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. This completion included "approximately 1,500 athletes from high school and junior rowing programs across the country competing for national titles in 18 boat classes." http://www.usrowing.org/events/YouthNationals.aspx

ESD's Men's Varsity Quad (Nelson, Jamieson, Meier and Laba) represented ESD at Nationals based on their regional qualification and earned a 12th place finish. Previous ESD National bids included the 2000 Men's Varsity Quad, the 2004 & 2005 Women's Varsity Single and the 2007 Women's Varsity Quad. Congratulations to all these athletes!

Coached by Head Coach Matthew Naifeh '05 and Assistant Coach Kelly McKinley, ESD Crew had a very successful year and is poised for continued success in the years to come.

The ESD Men's Lacrosse team had another excellent season, finishing their

SPC schedule with a 7-1 record, their north district schedule with a 6-2 record and their overall season with a 17-6 record.

The nine seniors on the team all made their mark on the 2011 season. Captains James Collins, Tyler Lee, and Philip Wagley led the offense in assists and scoring throughout the season, while Trevor Garfield, and Captain Ted Guevel led a dominant defense. Captain

Senior Sam TaCito became stronger at face off with each game and was instrumental in regionals by winning the majority of possessions. John Stephen Khoury was a key player in defense, transitioning the ball down the field, as well as playing offense as a midfielder. The injured Angus Klamer returned during playoffs at the Attack position and made an immediate impact to the team. Also contributing greatly on offense were Jack Beare, Hayden Wilson, Michael Collins, and Barrett Anigian. Jack Blair and Blake Moore were both contributors early and then suffered injuries. On defense, the junior trio

ESD travelled to Austin for the SPC tournament as the second seed in North Zone.
After dispatching Kincaid

easily, they played St Mark's in the final. In a closely matched, heated battle, the Lions emerged as the victor. After SPC, the Eagles finished their North district season strongly and beat Plano Senior High convincingly. With the win, ESD advanced to the Super-Regionals as the third seed.

Super-Regionals were also held in Austin. ESD easily defeated Houston Christian (HC), scoring eleven goals by halftime and holding HC scoreless. Each team added four goals in the second half, but ESD came out on top – the final score was ESD15 and HC 4. The Eagles then faced Austin High, which had defeated ESD earlier in the season in overtime. In a hard fought

game, ESD emerged victorious 8-4, and secured its first State Tournament bid in three years. In the State Tournament, held at the Woodlands, ESD unfortunately faltered to strong second-seed Dallas Jesuit (4-7) in the semifinal game. Coppell, which had defeated St. Mark's in its semi-final match-up (11-10), defeated Jesuit in the final 10-8.

The team was rounded out with a skilled supporting cast that will be a strong force for the 2012 Eagles: Joe Fojtasek, Landen Cibulka, Chris Merritt, Michael Payne, Richie Loftus, and Colby Rachor. ■

ESD BASEBALL: VARSITY



The varsity baseball team completed another successful season and continued its impressive string of Division I baseball appearances in the Spring SPC tournament. ESD's run in the tournament was cut short with a loss to eventual champion

Episcopal High School of Houston, despite a tremendous pitching performance by senior Nate Cole, who struck out eleven Episcopal Houston batters in five innings. The team posted an overall record of 16-14 and an SPC record of 4-4.

Returning for his third year, Coach Troy Haugen challenged the team with a difficult non-conference and tournament schedule. The team responded with a second place showing in the North Dallas High School tournament, which was comprised of 4A and 5A UIL teams. The Eagles lost in the championship game to a talented Desoto team. In the Richardson Berkner tournament, which also consisted of large UIL schools, ESD again finished second, losing to Richardson Berkner in the final. However, significant wins were posted by the team in the tournament over Sachse (12-3) and Tyler Lee (10-9). Bryce Anglin and Tiger Smith were selected All-Tournament for the Berkner event.

The team's momentum was slowed during the mid-season due to some key injuries, but significant wins were obtained over North Zone rivals Trinity Valley (5-0) and Holland Hall (12-1.) Early April began with an impressive win over traditional 5A baseball powerhouse Lake Highlands (12-11), and that helped the team regain momentum.

Nate Cole and Bryce Anglin were awarded All-SPC honors, while Nate Cole and Kevin Leib earned All-Zone recognition for their accomplishments during the season. Nate Cole led all high school pitchers in the DFW metroplex with 111 strikeouts and was among the leaders in ERA. Bryce Anglin posted a .529 batting average, which included a team-leading 7 triples and 37 RBIs, placing him among the area leaders in high school baseball as well. Travis Conine had a solid season and led the team in stolen bases with 16. Kevin Leib led the team in runs scored (29) while posting an impressive .438 batting average. Hunter Crow led the team in fielding percentage while playing the difficult position of catcher.

The team relied on many young players this season, such as freshmen William Butter who anchored centerfield and Oscar Benavides who played three different positions during the season. Sophomores Seth Stukalin and


Heidi Hall '12 took over for Puckett, she
