*The official grades of record for ESD are the semester grades/credits posted to a student's transcript. GPAs are calculated by taking the total number of grade points earned and dividing by the total number of semester grades earned (for grades only, no GPA credit for pass/fail classes).

*Honors classes are weighted ½ point, and Advanced Placement classes are weighted one full point when the grade point average is computed.

Academic Course Load

Students choose courses each semester from the major areas of study. A student is required to enroll in at least four academic core courses plus one additional course. **Psychology is considered a science elective. Engineering I is considered a science elective. Engineering II can be counted as a lab science elective or a computer science credit. World Cultures is considered a ½ credit of History and a ½ credit of Religion.*

Class Rank

The policy of The Episcopal School of Dallas is to numerically rank only the top ten percent of students at the end of their senior year and to not rank the remainder of the class. A student must have attended ESD for two years to be ranked. Only the grades from The Episcopal School of Dallas are averaged.

It is the policy of The Episcopal School of Dallas not to disclose student disciplinary records.

Grading Periods

The academic year is divided into two eighteen-week semesters. Examinations are given at the end of each semester. One unit of credit is given for each course when the student successfully completes one year of work. One-half credit is given for the successful completion of work in a subject for one semester.

Advanced Placement

Students at ESD must apply for departmental approval to take honors and AP courses. Students who want to enroll in more than three honors or AP courses must have approval from the Head of Upper School. Students who take AP courses are required to take the CEEB Advanced Placement exams in May.

In the 2018-2019 school year, ESD administered 677 AP exams to 263 students in the upper school. Eighty-eight percent of students received a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam. Of the 108 students in the class of 2019, 105 took at least one AP course.

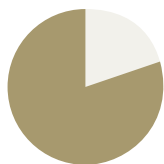

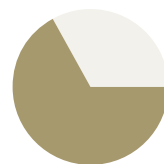
